Review of Updates

- All club meeting
 - 6% of all clubs attended meeting
 - They are all docked 1 point in club standing
 - Email response they did not attend
 - Had all been warned
 - Some clubs did sign up for adopt-a-block process
- Brandon: Grant and Brandon are meeting with IT to make video on how to do the printing service
 - Will make printing on midterms week free up to budget limit
 - Bulletin will be publishing an article

Maggie: New York Times

- Met with a representative from the New York Times
- Paying \$17,000/yr. for times with 100 copies a day and 100 academic subscriptions that last 24 hours daily
- Cancel academic subscription in place of online usage
 - Instead, all GU staff and faculty will get online usage for one year
 - Library will contribute money to cover this cost
 - Cost will go to \$22,000 a year (still gets 100 copies a day, cheaper than cancelling print)
 - But, we will be paying about \$5,000 a year to keep influence with the program
 - This consolidates historical New York Times from library and the news we are paying for
- Online service has advantages
 - Many languages, has leading professors create news stories
 - Multi-cultural articles
 - Huge historical archives
- New York Times back to campus March 14 and wants to talk to GSBA (and all other respective groups) about this program
 - Tabling, workshops, giveaways
 - She will need to work with GUEST for tabling
- Wants to get faculty to help pay for it
- Trying to get it moved to the front desk of Hemmingson

- Can gauge amount of student readership
- Meeting with library contact, can then go to academic deans
 - But worthwhile to suggest to academic deans to see if they may want to take part in paying for this program

Alex: Constitution

- Class officer amendment written
- Academic senators will be next
- Get passed or moved to February 29th, where it will flop or pass
- Constitution will be written over Spring break, then it will need to be passed on March 14th

Taylor: Spokane Gives

- Met with the mayor, April 2nd is Spokane Gives
- Competition with other universities
- Trying to get 20% increase in service hours over what each university had over month of April
- Printing out weekly barometer in each university to show how much service each university is contributing up through the event
 - Work to create poster
- GSBA, GU, and faculty/staff all participants
 - Maybe invite all individuals who applied
